Call for Papers: *Report* 2024

The editors of *Report* invite all undergraduate students and recent graduates to submit articles for Volume 14, scheduled to be published in May 2024. The theme for next year's issue is "innovation and technology," but papers examining all topics and fields of history will be considered for publication. Submissions will be reviewed on a semi-rolling basis with two rounds of review. Papers submitted by November 1, 2023 will be considered in Round 1, and authors will be notified of decisions November 13. Papers received by February 1, 2024 will be considered in Round 2, and authors will be notified of decisions February 16. Submission Guidelines

- Authors must be current undergraduates or recent graduates within the last 12 months. Authors do not need to have attended or graduated from West Point to submit papers for consideration.
- Submissions must have been written during the course of the author's undergraduate studies.
- Authors may only submit one paper for consideration per publication cycle. However, if a paper was categorized as "revise and resubmit" during Round 1, authors are invited to revise their papers and resubmit for further review in Round 2.
- Papers based on original research or papers that examine historiographical subjects (rather than papers that synthesize secondary literature) are the strongest submissions.
- Article submissions should not be under consideration with other publishers or have been previously published.
- Submissions must be in Word (not PDF) format with Chicago-style footnotes.
- Authors wishing to include images with their articles must obtain and provide proof of copyright permissions prior to submission.
- The recommended word count is 3,000-6,000 words, but the editors welcome submissions of both longer and shorter lengths.
